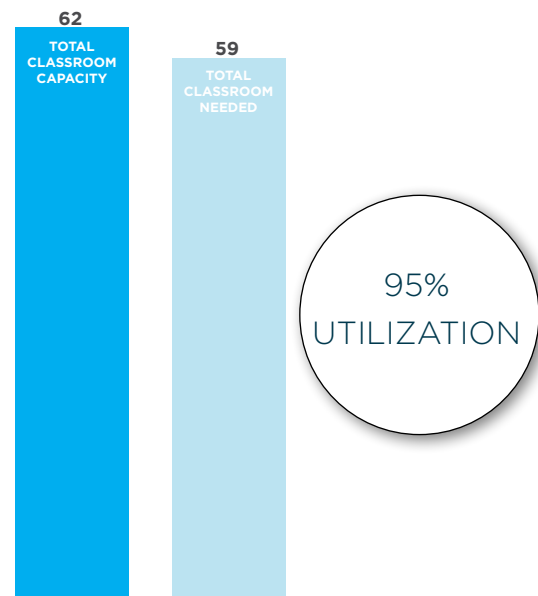

SCHOOL MISSION STATEMENT

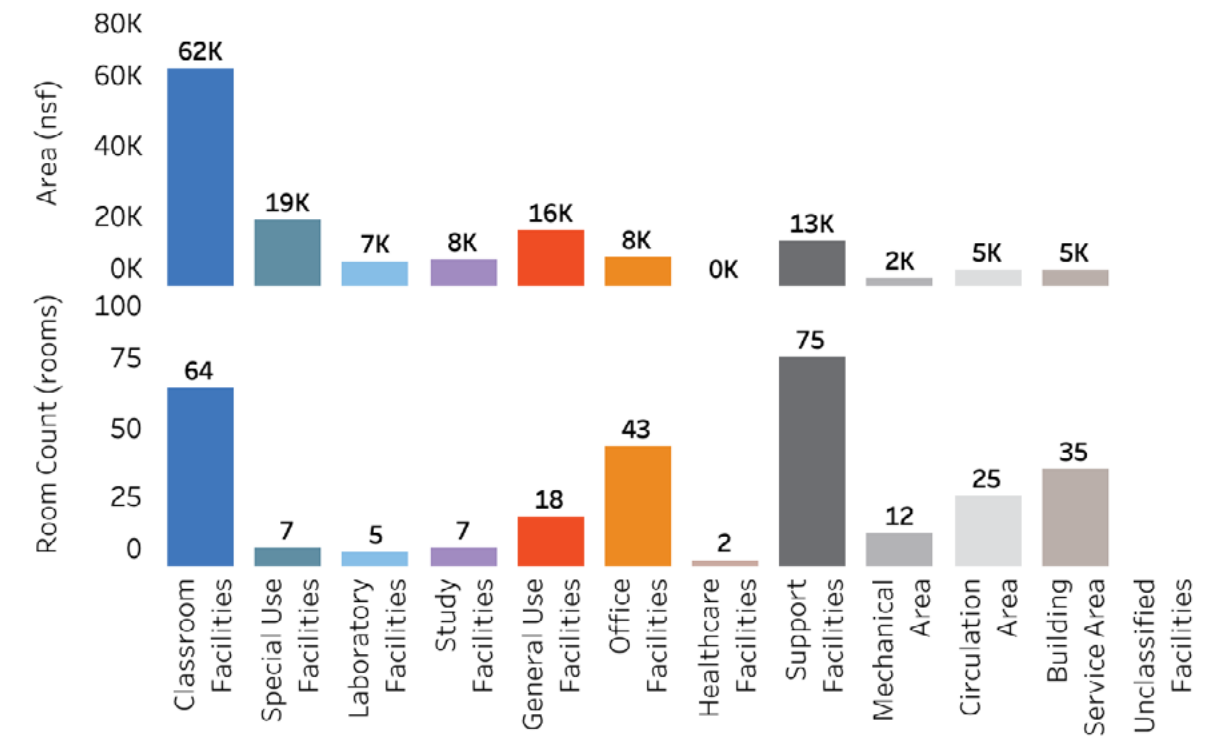

ESTIMATED CLASSROOM UTILIZATION FOR 2018-19

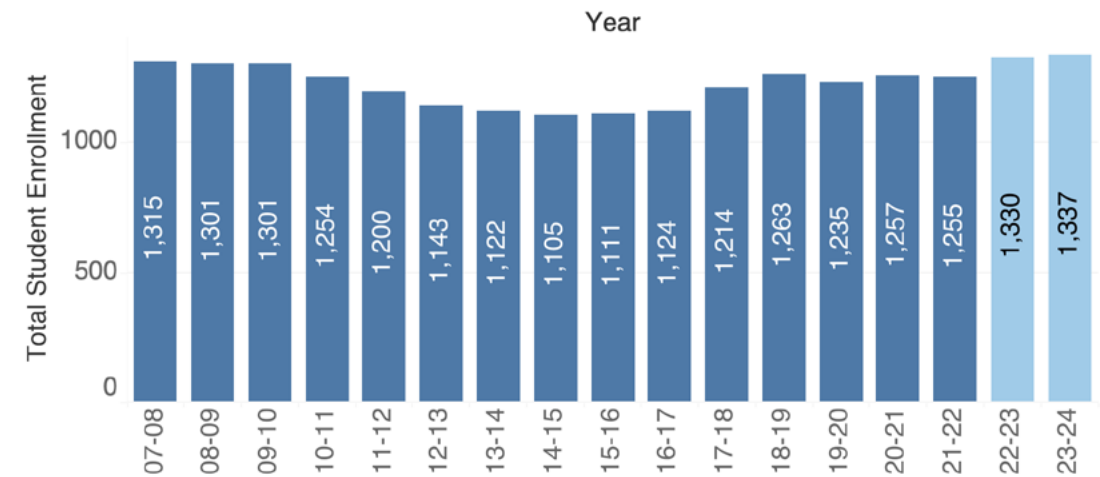
